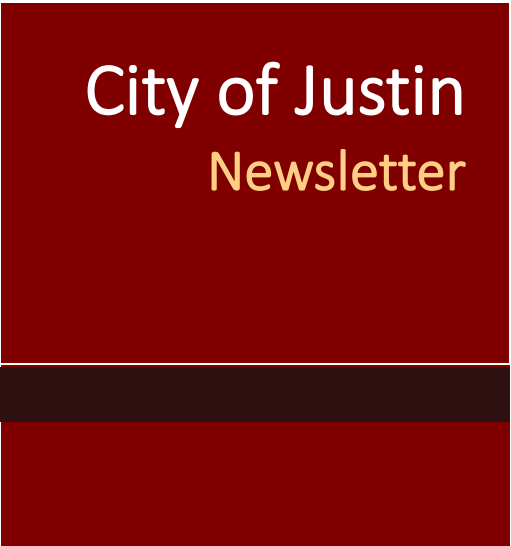

City of Justin Special Election November 6, 2018 Proposition A – Sales Tax Reallocation

The Justin City Council has called for a special election to consider the possible reallocation of a portion of the local option sales tax.

Ballot language:

“the reduction of the local sales and use tax in the City of Justin dedicated for the benefit of a section 4a and 4b economic development corporations from one-half (1/2) of one percent to one-fourth (1/4) of one percent each and authorization for the adoption of a one-half (1/2) of one percent sales tax to provide revenue for maintenance and repair of municipal streets.”

****Neither option will result in any change to the overall sales tax rate, nor to the overall property tax rate.**

A Vote “Yes” Means:

- The Economic Development Corporation (Type 4A) will receive ¼ cent sales tax.
- The Community Development Corporation (Type 4B) will receive ¼ cent sales tax.
- A newly-established Street Maintenance & Repair Fund will receive ½ cent sales tax.
- The City of Justin will continue to receive one cent sales tax toward general fund operations.

A Vote “No” Means:

- The Economic Development Corporation (Type 4A) will continue to receive ½ cent sales tax.
- The Community Development Corporation (Type 4B) will continue to receive ½ cent sales tax.
- A Street Maintenance and Repair fund will not be established.
- The City of Justin will continue to receive one cent of sales tax toward general fund operations.

In the last 12 months of payments, the total local option sales tax received was \$1,147,164.90; \$573,582.45 was allocated to the 4A and 4B economic development corporations.

As split under the current structure, the 4A and 4B corporations each received \$286,791.23

If the ½ cent sales tax were allocated to the Street Maintenance & Repair Fund, the 4A and 4B would have each received \$143,395.61 and the Street Maintenance & Repair Fund would have received \$286,791.23.

Early voting runs from October 22nd through November 2nd

Early voting will be conducted at Justin City Hall and other county locations

Election Day is Tuesday, November 6th

Election Day voting will be conducted at Justin City Hall
