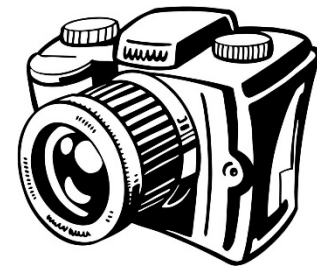

### FM 156

As construction continues on FM 156, be sure to follow the Facebook page at [www.facebook.com/156update](http://www.facebook.com/156update) for the latest information regarding lane closures, progress on construction, and any new alerts. The City updates this page as soon we receive updates from TxDOT.

Estimated timeline from TxDOT:

- Traffic should switch to the new northbound lanes and construction on the southbound lanes will begin September or October 2018.
- Entire project has an estimated completion date of November 2019.

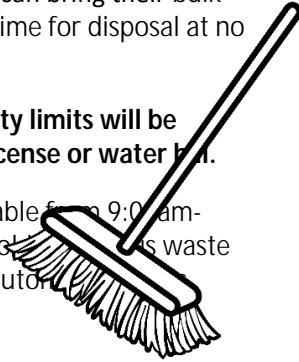

### Fall Cleanup Event

The City of Justin will hold our Annual Clean-Up Event on Saturday, October 27th, 2018 from 8:00am to 12:00pm. Residents of Justin can bring their bulk trash to City Hall during that time for disposal at no cost.

**Proof of residency in Justin city limits will be required through a driver's license or water bill.**

The Crud Cruiser will be available from 9:00am-11:00am to take your household hazardous waste such as paint, batteries, and auto fluids.  
\*No tires will be accepted\*



We will also have Electronic Waste Recycling and Paper Shredding available. E-waste includes:

- Cell phones
- Laptops (with or without hard drive)
- Computer Towers (with or without hard drive)
- Monitors, Keyboards, and Mice
- Power Cords and Speakers
- Desktop Printers and Scanners

Paper Shredding Includes all sensitive documents such as:

- Banking info, checks, statements, records
- Payroll information
- Financial statements
- Insurance information

No need to remove paper clips, staples, file folders, or rubber bands...we can shred those!

## City Council, Board, & Commission Updates

**Rental Inspection Program:** The City Council is considering implementation of an inspection program for single-family rental homes. If implemented, a City Inspector would perform an inspection of a rental home and issue a certificate to the landlord before a tenant moved in. This inspection would be required every time a new tenant moved into a home or every three years, whichever comes first. The inspection would ensure compliance with already existing code requirements, including safe electrical wiring, repaired driveways and exteriors, and leaking faucets. A full list of requirements is available for public review at City Hall. City Council will be discussing this program again on September 24, 2018.

**Backflow Testing Requirements:** On May 21, 2018, the City Council voted to amend the city's adoption of the International Plumbing Code. The city no longer requires annual inspection of **residential** irrigation Backflow Prevention Assembly Devices. The City does encourage all residents to ensure that their irrigation systems are properly functioning, but no regular annual testing is required.
