Estimated timeline from TxDOT:

- Traffic should switch to the new northbound lanes and construction on the southbound lanes will begin on November 2018.

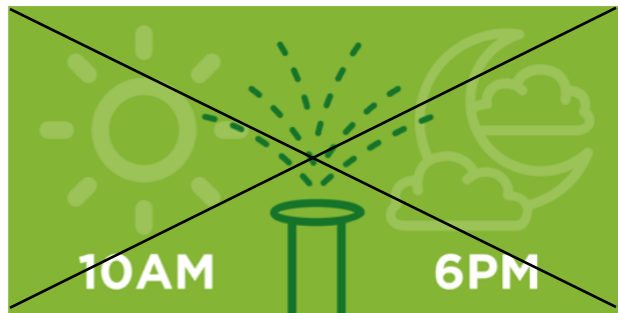
He graduated from High School in Eules, Texas and is a graduate of the University of North Texas where he

As a reminder please avoid watering from 10am-6pm when most water from sprinklers will be lost to evaporation in the heat of the day. Also, repairing sprinkler heads and adjusting heads to only water grass, not pavement, will reduce water waste.



Did You Know?

The City wants to make sure you are aware of several common parking violations, and we want to make sure you are in compliance! Increased enforcement will begin for the following parking violations in the coming months:

Texas Transportation Code - TRANSP § 545.302. Stopping, Standing, or Parking Prohibited in Certain Places

An operator may not, except momentarily to pick up or discharge a passenger, stand or park an occupied or unoccupied vehicle:

- in front of a public or private driveway;
- within 15 feet of a fire hydrant;
- within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection;
- within 30 feet on the approach to a flashing signal, stop sign, yield sign, or traffic control signal located at the side of a roadway
