City of Justin Spring Cleanup Event

On Saturday April 21st, from 8:00am-12:00pm the City will host a Spring Cleanup Event. Residents of Justin will be provided an opportunity to bring bulk waste and garbage to Justin City Hall. This year we will also have a company onsite to collect e-waste and to perform document shredding.

Materials accepted for e-recycling include: cell phones, laptops, computer towers, monitors, keyboards, mice, printers, scanners, speakers, power cords, and other small household electronics. A \$20.00 fee will be charged for TV's up to 65", CRT computer monitors, and hard drive destruction.

Materials accepted for shredding are: banking info, checks, junk mail, employment info, education records, etc.

In addition, this year, the City will also accept tree limbs and brush. The City will be mulching the branches and limbs, and will provide mulch free of charge to Justin residents during that time.

Don't forget to bring a Justin utility bill or driver's license for proof of residency!

City Council, Board, & Commission Updates

- The City Council recently approved an update to the Landscape & Buffer Ordinance. This ordinance is in place to ensure adequate buffers (fencing, trees, berms, etc.) between different types of development (commercial, residential, etc.)
- The Planning & Zoning Commission continues to work through ordinance updates relating to code enforcement (overhanging tree limbs, RV parking, outside storage, vehicles parked in yards, etc.) All P&Z meetings are open to the public and your input is welcomed during the public comment portion of the meetings.
- The Planning & Zoning Commission is also working through ordinances relating specifically to our Old Town Business District. The goal is to ensure we maintain the historic feel of the old town area in advance of any future developments.
